The New Maroon Stickers are here! The Transfer Station Stickers are mandatory to use the Transfer Station (Dump). The color of the Transfer Station Stickers are changed to insure only current owners and occupants are using the facility. There is no additional cost for the stickers; they are included in the assessments. Stickers can be picked up at the association office, be sure to have your vehicle information, license plate number, make and model, ready to receive your sticker!

Want to get rid of some old tires, while helping to save the association money and putting it to better use? There will be a free tire collection event at the Transfer Station on Saturday, January 14th from 8am-12pm. You can bring up to 9 tires off the rims, 17" or smaller, and Tehama County will haul away the tires free of charge! The normal cost for the association to have the tires hauled away is \$3.00 per tire. So come on January 14th and bring your old tires to the transfer station.

ARE YOUR ADDRESS NUMBERS POSTED CORRECTLY?

During an emergency time is critical. It is very important that your property address numbers are posted correctly so that emergency responders can find you quickly. Tehama County Fire Department has set standards for posting address numbers. Address numbers need to be clearly posted by the entrance to the property drive way visible from both directions of traffic. Each number should be 4" high and 3/8" wide, reflective on contrasting background. Numbers are most easily seen on a post. A nearby tree is not as easy to spot, and can take medical personnel much longer to find you. Numbers should be visible from any direction traveled on the roadway. Never place items in front of your address numbers, such as decorations or flower arrangements. Never allowed the accumulation of shrubbery, or leaves to block the address.
