Transfer Station Guidelines

Listed below are updated use guidelines for the Rancho Tehama Association. Please review and address any questions or comments to the Association Office. These guidelines are put in place to update older outdated guidelines as we are able to take more items than we were in the past. Adhering to these guidelines ensures equal use to all members and residents.

- 1) Transfer Station Use is for Members and Rancho Tehama Residents ONLY. Stickers from the Association are required for use of the facility
- 2) Daily use is allowed for daily compactor trash and recycle items
- 3) Construction waste and other "Clean up" shall be disposed of in special bins LIMIT one full load 4x4 (16 cubic feet) per week. Nails must be removed or nailed down from construction wood
- 4) No oil or lead base paint
- 5) No vegetation
- 6) No contractors
- 7) No commercial handymen or clean-up crews
- 8) Once bins are filled you may be required to wait to bring your load until a new bin is obtained

Upcoming Board Meetings: The Board Meeting for September has been changed from September 23rd to September 26th at 10am. The rest of 2015 Board Meetings are: Thursday October 22nd at 6pm, Saturday November 21st at 10am and Thursday December 17th at 6pm.

Make your property fire safe

Firefighter's agree: It's not if, but when, fire will burn through areas susceptible to wildfire such as Rancho Tehama. Firefighters need your help to give your property and community a fighting chance to withstand wildfire by creating a defensible space around your home. Defensible space is a modified landscape surrounding your home that increases your home's chance of surviving a wildfire.

The Resource Conservation District of Tehama County (RCD) has been working on developing ridge top road side fuel breaks within the community and will continue the project this fall. As part of this service to Rancho Tehama the RCD is also promoting awareness for the need of defensible space around the home from wildfire. The RCD is now looking for a few property owners who are willing to accept assistance with the planning and development of good defensible space around their home and buildings. This service is being offered in exchange for permission to showcase their property as an example of good defensible space.

The RCD recognizes the importance in preventing wildfire through defensible space and wants to help make your property a fire safe property! Defensible space is the removal of dead and dying vegetation, spacing of shrubs and trees and removal of tree limbs to a height of 6 feet. We would like to find a home owner who has taken the first step in developing defensible space and now has only shrubs and trees in need of trimming and spacing. The RCD will clear a 30-100 foot buffer around buildings and provide a chipper for disposal of woody vegetation. The newly developed defensible space will help firefighters to defend your home as well as reduce the possibility of catastrophic loss of life and property in the event of a wildfire.

This wildfire fuel reduction project offered by the RCD is free to project participants.
